Enroll in Stanford University's ARFID Study

This study is open to **children between the ages of 6 and 12 with a CURRENT diagnosis of Avoidant Restrictive Food Intake Disorder (ARFID)** who are able to speak English and medically stable for outpatient treatment

Participants and their families undergo Family-Based Treatment (FBT) vs. a manualized Non-Specific Care (NSC) in a research study through the Stanford Department of Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences

14 one-hour sessions occur in either FBT or NSC (with medical management) over the course of 4 months

Led by doctoral-level, highly skilled eating disorders therapists
